"We are currently expanding the Francistown Depot storage facilities with an additional 60 million litres. Upon completion, the holding capacity will be increased to 98 million litres of petroleum products," Mokgosi announced. This state-of-the-art facility will include a loading and offloading gantry, a truck staging area, and a product testing laboratory.

Despite encountering challenges in public comprehen-

sion of its role, BOL is proactively addressing this through an educational campaign. "We have embarked on an educational campaign to inform people about our mandate, products, and services, and how various stakeholders can take part in the petroleum value chain," Mokgosi noted.

Looking towards the future, BOL envisions remarkable growth and substantial contributions to the national revenue. "Through planned conversion of coal-to-liquid projects, we aim to establish a new ecosystem of a petrochemicals industry, producing a variety of products including petroleum products for the local market, bitumen, biofuels, and fertilisers to name a few," Mokgosi revealed. The company also foresees a surge in citizen owned maintenance workshops, fostering job creation and the emergence of services related to transport, customs clearance, and logistics management.
